Provided issue brief on underage drinking to local elected leaders

Created Fundraising and Treatment Subcommittees

Sent a team of 6 youth and 2 adults to the Tennessee Teen Institute (TTI)

Partnered with Representative John Ragan, Senator Randy McNally, and Anderson County Commission to introduce legislation to the Tennessee General Assembly to protect adolescents from alcohol abuse

Began administering the DADAS grant without a fiscal agent

Secured funding to reduce underage drinking through the STOP Act

Held first fundraiser; Wheel Through the Hills

Partnered with Anderson County Beer Board and County Commission to pass an ordinance mandating training for clerks selling alcohol; trained 22 people [100% passing rate; average test score of 97.9%]

Reached 990 students through Reach Out Now [increased knowledge among 97.1% of students reached; increased perception of harm of alcohol by 14%]

Reached 492 students through Super Bowl: Health Awareness program with Antone Davis


Reached 243 students through Life Skills Training [increased assertiveness 24.8%; increased self-control 12.3%; increased antidrug score 16.9%]
