PROGRAMMING

During this quarter, the staff and volunteers of Allies for Substance Abuse Prevention delivered 25 programs/trainings to a total of 2564 people [257% change from previous quarter in total presentations, +422% change from previous quarter in people reached / +67% change from the same quarter of the previous year in total presentations, +280% change from the same quarter of the previous year in people reached]. In addition, the permanent medicine disposal bins collected 807 pounds of medicine. To date, the medicine collection program has collected a combined 6995.5 pounds.

MATERIALS

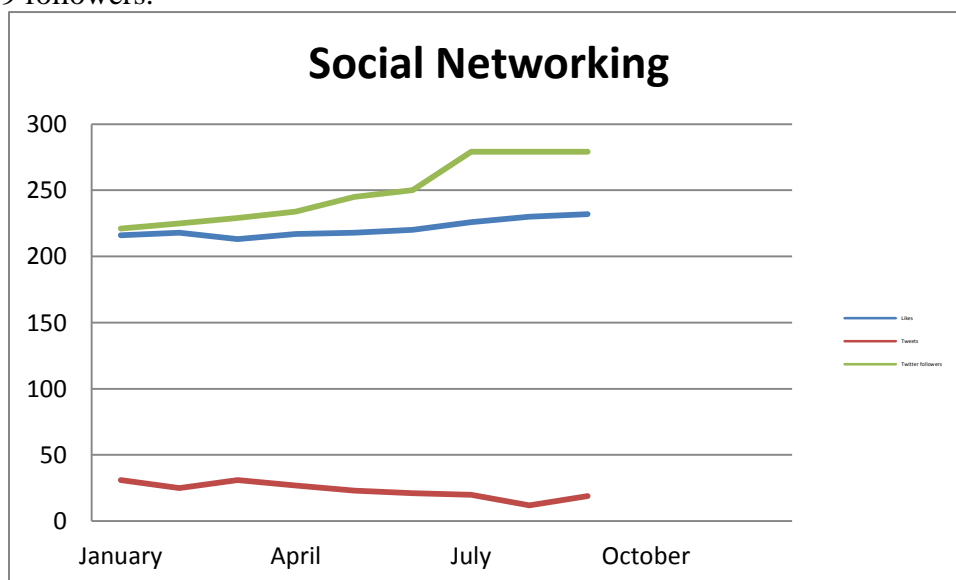
Allies for Substance Abuse Prevention disseminated 2874 materials in the community during this quarter [+9% change from previous quarter / +3% change from the same quarter of the previous year].

RESOURCES (Cash and in-kind)

During this quarter, the staff and volunteers of Allies for Substance Abuse Prevention generated \$20,217.37 in matching funds [+48% change from previous quarter / -48% change from the same quarter of the previous year].

SOCIAL NETWORKING

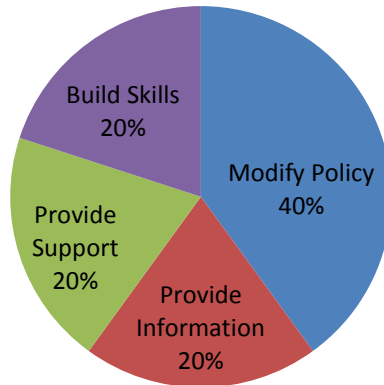
